# **A Summer to Remember!**

It's been an incredible summer at Rancho Cielo, kicking off with two successful cohorts of our driver's education program. We have now had 125 students participate; 100 students have earned driver's permits, and 54 of them have obtained licenses. In August, a 1952 MG, fully restored by students from our Classic Car Restoration Program, was highlighted throughout Monterey Car Week and displayed at the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance and Quail Lodge. It was a wonderful opportunity to highlight the amazing work of our students and the program, which is filling an important niche in training the next generation of car restoration professionals as industry veterans retire. We also had the ninth annual Veggie Box & BBQ Fundraiser. With what can only be described as a "village" of staff and volunteers who make it possible, the impact is beyond anything I've ever experienced. This year, we even extended the reach beyond the Monterey region to serve families in need in East Palo Alto and Redwood City. Topping it off, beautiful organic tomatoes from our Leadership Garden, cultivated in part by our students, took first place at the Monterey County Fair!

We are also excited to announce the launch of our new **After School Program**, designed to address the diverse needs of our students, with essential support and opportunities in several key areas: academic support, safety and supervision, social development, recreational engagement, and mental and emotional well-being. Of note, graduate and Monterey area native **Terry Poole**, has come full circle back to our community as the After School Program Manager and mentor to our youth. # Student Spotlight MYNDY FUENTES

After learning about Rancho Cielo, 19-year-old Drummond Culinary Academy student Myndy Fuentes knew it was the perfect fit. Plus, she's always loved baking.

"I'm not the best in crowds," she says.
"Going to Alisal [High School] with
more than 3,000 students was not a
good fit for her: There wasn't any oneon-one with the teachers."

Over the last two years, Fuentes has benefited from smaller classes—she's on track to graduate in Spring of 2025—which, ironically, has helped with her social anxiety. She feels more confident communicating with people in general.

The proof is in the four internships in which she's excelled at four highend restaurants throughout Monterey County, including **Lucia Restaurant** and Bar at Bernardus in Carmel Valley and Alila at Ventana in Big Sur.

Having case manager Joshua Cash as a sounding board and a helping hand has also been beneficial. At Alisal High, Fuentes found it difficult to connect with her guidance counselor.

When Fuentes is asked what she will do post-Rancho Cielo, she quickly responds: She hopes to continue her education at **Auguste Escoffier School of Culinary Arts** in Boulder, Colorado, studying to become a pastry chef. Through the wisdom of some of her culinary mentors, like instructor

"I can make any type of ice cream,"
she says excitedly. "Last week, I made
some fresh mint chocolate chip, coffee

and vanilla ice cream."

It's not about reinventing the wheel for Fuentes. It's all about making the best wheel in the world.

After Kevin Orozco failed every class except one in his junior year at Alisal High School, he couldn't envision graduating high school. Then, he

heard about Rancho Cielo. "I knew I wanted to go [to Rancho Cielo]," Orozco, who was initially attracted by the Auto & Diesel Repair program, says.

When the 19-year-old started his senior year at the 100-acre campus, he discovered something much more than he imagined: A sanctuary equipped to assist—Orozco has learning differences—with his academics on a personalized level that he had never had previously.

"I was not getting the support I needed [at Alisal]," Orozco says.

"And I felt somewhat afraid to ask for help. At Rancho Cielo, multiple people were checking in on me at once. There are so many people here giving you really good support. Whenever you need them, they'll help you." The Salinas native says it felt good to graduate from high school and it feels better to know he still has a support system despite no longer being a Rancho Cielo student.

"All of the teachers reassured me that I can come back [to Rancho] whenever I need," Orozco says.

Orozco is taking mechanics and business classes at **Hartnell College**. He's also working at a Salinas autobody shop. He comes by Rancho Cielo frequently to talk to his mentor, Auto & Diesel Repair instructor Luis Ruiz.

"I come here to talk to [Luis] when I need clarity on some stuff," Orozco explains.

He says Ruiz provides him with a lot of solid advice, but the one that sticks with him most: "Not everyone you meet is your friend, but everyone can teach you something."

It also showcases one of the values Rancho founder Judge Phillips relied on to turn his dream of Rancho Cielo into reality: anything is possible if our community and local businesses rally together and show support.

In addition to the proceeds going directly to Rancho Cielo, several thousand veggie boxes also benefited some of our area charity/nonprofit partners, including the Boys & Girls Club of Monterey County, Second Harvest Food Bank Santa Cruz.

# New YouthBuild Partnership Propels Construction and Culinary Programs

Rancho Cielo is boosting its Construction & Sustainable Design Academy and Drummond Culinary Academy (DCA), further amplifying their impact on our students' education and community, thanks to a recent partnership with YouthBuild. "Through this public-private partnership with the Department of Labor, Rancho Cielo will be able to expand the DCA and realize our culinary dreams in the pastry arts," says Rancho Cielo CEO Chris Devers. "We'll also be able to serve more students and prepare more students for jobs."

The partnership funds construction and culinary training programs, including credentials like NCCR and ProStart. YouthBuild also provides education, vocational training and leadership development to help students find sustainable careers. Additionally, students will gain the

skills necessary for the construction jobs of tomorrow while prioritizing the

creation of homes that are conducive to human health and harmonious with the environment.

"[YouthBuild] encompasses education, occupational skills training, leadership development and a large focus on high-quality post-program placement opportunities," says Rancho's YouthBuild Program Manager Jonathan Phan.

Phan emphasizes that all housing projects must be geared toward low-income families, aligning with

the program's community-focused mission.

"YouthBuild sets up the students to have fruitful careers but also focuses

on community as something to help build and be a part of," he says.
